


















The event is organised to celebrate the accomplishments of those who have completed the Institute's long-term executive programmes:

They are implemented with support from the governments of Tanzania and Finland. The WLP receives support from the two governments as well as the European Union and UN Women.

Mrs. Innes-Stubb is the spouse of the 13th President of the Republic of Finland, Alexander Stubb. She was born in Solihull, UK, on 25 January 1970. Innes-Stubb is a British and (since May 2017) Finnish citizen.

She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Surrey, where she studied law, French and German. Innes-Stubb is qualified as solicitor in England and Wales. She earned her Master of Laws (LLM) degree in European Law at the College of Europe in Bruges, Belgium, in 1995.


After graduation, Mrs. Innes-Stubb worked in London, as a solicitor for the UK Government Legal Service. She then moved on to the law firm White & Case, working in its offices both in Helsinki and Brussels. She focused particularly on issues related to competition law and data protection.

In 2014, she joined the Sanoma Group, where she was responsible for tasks related to competition law, ethics and compliance. From 2017 to 2024, she worked at KONE Oyj, where she led and managed the

global compliance team (Vice President, Global Compliance). The team's areas of responsibility include KONE's Code of Conduct; human rights programmes; sanctions, anti-bribery & corruption; and work against harassment and discrimination. In September 2024, Innes-Stubb became an Executive in Residence for business law at Aalto University.

Mrs. Innes-Stubb is a member of Finnish Ethics and Compliance Officers Network. She has also made several presentations on the topic at various professional events. Previously, she also served as a board member of the American Chamber of Commerce in Finland.

She speaks English, French, German, Swedish and Finnish.

It provides them with unparalleled learning opportunities through the Women's Leadership Forum (WLF), training, coaching, and mentoring.

The WLF brings together political and business leaders to exchange ideas and share best practices to promote women's inclusion in leadership roles. Training hones in on participants' ability to manage their inner selves, lead others, and harness resources. Coaching focuses on helping participants identify areas where they feel less proficient at and create key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure progress through one-one-one and group sessions. The mentoring approach is aimed at supporting participants to become the leaders they want to be. It provides tactics on how to find mentors, as well as nurture and maintain those relationships.

Senior Research Fellow, Aalto University School of Business

O'Shea is a specialist in strategy deployment and developing innovative global collaborations in complex and chaotic environments. He has worked in this field since 1998 developing innovative and entrepreneurial ecosystems, especially in the Nordic and Baltic countries, Russia, India, the Gulf-States, Iran, Turkey, Korea, Japan, and the USA.

His background in corporate strategy formulation and deployment allowed him to serve as a Corporate Finance Director and Head of Business Development in two of the UK's largest retail companies. He also served as a Managing Director of two consulting companies in Finland, and as a Partner in Cambridge to a UK-based consultancy specialising in transformation and innovation.



Ombeni Sefue

Chairperson of the Board of Directors, UONGOZI Institute

Sefue previously served as Chief Secretary to the President of the United Republic of Tanzania (2011 – 2016) after a successful career as a diplomat. His postings included: Permanent Representative of Tanzania to the United Nations, Ambassador to the United States of America, High Commissioner to Canada, and Counsellor in the Embassy of Tanzania in Stockholm, Sweden.

He also worked as as a speechwriter and personal assistant to two Tanzanian Presidents — Ali Hassan Mwinyi (1993 – 1995) and Benjamin William Mkapa.

He was part of the team behind the landmark Our Common Interest: Report of the Commission for Africa, published by the Commission of Africa (The Blair Commission) in March 2005. Alongside President Mkapa, he participated in the 2005 G8 Summit that discussed the report.

Sefue also serves as Chairperson of the Board of Directors of Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation. Furthermore, he has been a member and chairman of the Panel of Eminent Persons of the African Peer Review Mechanism (APRM).



Minna Halme

Professor of Sustainability Management, Aalto University

Halme's research focuses on sustainable innovations and co-creating inclusive business models in low-income contexts. She teaches Sustainability Management at Aalto's Creative Sustainability Master's Programme, Executive MBA courses in Finland and South Korea, and the CEMS MIM International Master's Programme.

She is a member of the Advisory Board of Finland's largest retailer SOK, Finland's National Sustainable Development Panel, and the Central Finland Chamber of Commerce. She has held memberships in the UN Secretary-General's High-level Panel on Global Sustainability, Finnish Government Foresight 2030 Group, and Administrative Board of WWF Finland.

Halme is also a member of the Editorial Boards of Business Strategy and the Environment, Scandinavian Journal of Management and Organisation and Environment. She has participated in several European research projects and heads several national developments. She has received the Academy of Finland Award for the social impact of her research.
